## F/015/20 Mayors Report

- a. Mrs Arrand is happy for Council to lay a wreath for Norman. Cllr R Pender proposed to use local florist 'Farmhouse Florist'. Seconded by Cllr I Mason and carried. TC to organise.
- b. VE Day posters are available. Please help circulate as wide as possible.
- c. The graffiti is terrible. TC updated that it has been reported to NLC and police. She is awaiting a date for meeting with the local PCSOs to discuss further.
- d. The hedge on Godnow Road and treeline on Potts Lane are done. Thanks to NLC.

## F/015/20 Clerks Report

- a. NLC want council confirmation of the need for a CCTV camera located on the Library building. Agreed. TC to notify NLC of this requirement.
- b. Best Kept Village applications are out. TC to invite relevant groups and complete the return.

#### F/016/20 Ward Report

a. Recent flooding was not as bad as previous cases but prevalent across many gardens. The last meeting of MPs/EA & IDB met with 40+ personnel and confirmed C&E are still in the next round of funding and listed as a priority. Cllr J Reed will follow up on residential information relating to the telemetric system. She is also trying to engage another tier into local policy which will help shape, influence and offer another level of support to the community.

- b. Market Hall building works continue and repairs to the Community Hub are being chased to ensure the building is handed over on good order.
- c. The response regarding Fieldside is not satisfactory. A meeting with the Traffic Officer to get a better response is being organised.
- d. The A18 will be cleaned at the end of the contract in approximately 3 weeks.
- e. Pride of Ealand litter pick went well and bollards also cleaned.
- f. Glandford House shelving was collected and distributed between agreed groups.
- g. Budgets are under review for the grants.
- h. Capabilities for devolved grass cutting are looking at pairing up smaller Parish Councils to aid local needs.
- i. Planning for the Peatlands Railway project is up for planning tomorrow. Cllr I Mason requested clarification on the electrical infrastructure implementation notice for land owners and was advised that the Northern Power Grid will lead this element of the project and liaise with land owners in due course.
