B/162/20 Impact of Future New Builds within C&E

Cllr R Stewart raised the following matter for discussion and resolution:

"In light of numerous problems experienced by residents due to effects of heavy rainfall etc, this Council should consider requesting a moratorium on future new build plans for Crowle and Ealand to be forestalled until such times as infrastructure is improved to offset the problems currently experienced". Councillor opinion on this was spilt with some believing that progression is essential, but must be done with the upmost consideration and implementation of infrastructure to support development.

It was also noted that Town Councils cannot request a moratorium but can write to the district authority to place this request on our behalf.

Ward Cllrs and NLC are working extremely hard to get the upgrades put in place and have made significant progress. All councillors should remain proactive in progressing all complaints to Severn Trent regarding the sub-standard infrastructure and residents with issues should be advised to do the same to establish a firm record of complaints.

Land owners with riparian rights over drainage dykes are also being communicated with.
