Public Forum

Crowle & Ealand Drainage Group introduced themselves as a community group formed for 5 months and steadily growing in numbers, holding monthly meetings at the Liberal Club. They formed, as they believed resident's voices are not being heard. 2 main points were put forward to Council:

- The impact on the water table if 4R Group goes ahead.
- 7 Lakes planning stated they were to install their own sewerage plant when they applied for planning. This did not happen and the ever-growing site is causing more issues.

The group were informed that this Council has mandatory stimulation on all planning applications that 'Subject to adequate drainage and sewerage infrastructure installation' is added.

Council will schedule this item for agenda on 23rd April Business Meeting.

F/040/19 Regen Sign

Cllr Ramsden has had a number of residents commenting that the Regen sign appears as a business advertisement to a on the entrance to the town and is also distracting to drivers. Council reiterated that Regen is a not for profit organisation and does a huge amount of good work in this Town. An option to tackle this issue is to move the 'Crowle' sign at both ends of the Town forward by 100m thereby removing the distraction and still informing visitors and residents of the Regen contribution to the Town. TC to approach NLC.

F/041/19 Grass Cutting

The Grass cutting agreement has been adopted and the contractor appointed. Permission to use Roundup Glyphosate as per NLC and safety regulation usage was granted for use around trees and street furniture. Proposed Cllr M Bailey, second Cllr N Arrand and carried.
