Details	To provide the following Verge and PROW grass cutting within Crowle and Ealand: Grass Cutting To cut all designated areas, specified on the maps provided and indicated by the block green and hatched green areas. Verge Cuts Verge grass is to be cut to a minimum specification length of 30mm, carrying out 13 cuts per season on a three-week working cycle. Strimming around obstructions/street furniture and arisings blown clear of footways are to be included. Spraying is permitted following consultation and confirmation with the Town Council. Scheduled Cuts Scheduled cuts for Public Right of Way footpaths and bridleways are 5 cuts per season. Timings of these scheduled cuts are: Cut 1 – mid April Cut 2 – mid June Cut 3 – July Cut 4 – August Cut 5 – late Sep We understand that the weather may affect the cutting schedule and will, where reasonable, remain flexible. The contractor must communicate any variance to the schedule as soon as possible. Additional scheduled cuts may be requested. Weed Spraying To spray and remove weeds on all paths and rads within the Town's 30mph area. SAFETY REGULATIONS COMPLIANCE Applicants must agree to undertake the cutting operations in an orderly manner, complying with all relevant safety regulations, including for public safety.
